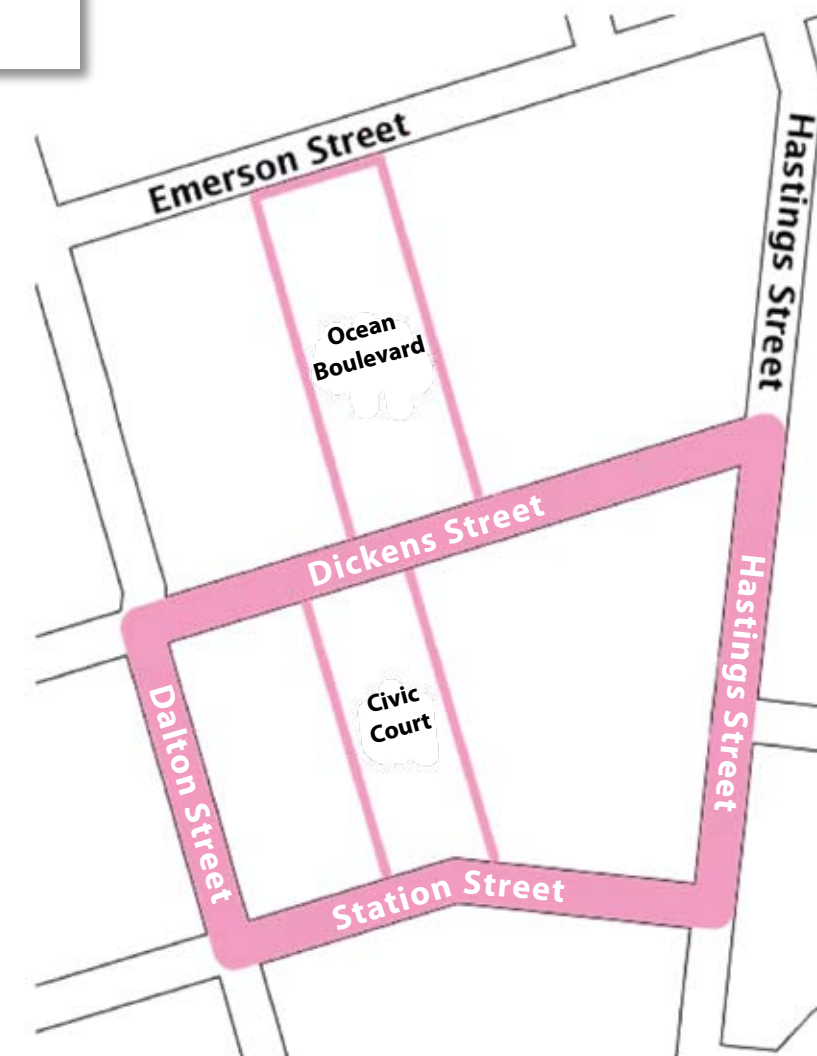

The Art Deco Trust is getting right in behind the Rugby 6, with the help of the Lotteries Commission and the REAL NZ Festival, is going to show our rugby visitors just how we celebrate the unique Art Deco flavour that our city embodies.

THE SOUP KITCHEN – Sat 17 Sept, 12 noon

On Saturday 17th September (the day before France v Canada) local Art Deco fans are urged to get their tickets for The Soup Kitchen. This event runs 12 noon to 2.30pm in the marquee at Napier's Sound Shell, and is a reprise of the ever popular Depression Dinner from Art Deco Weekend. A nourishing depression-style meal of soup and roast dinner will be served along with quality jazz music and a sing-a-long from the John Redman Band. This is always heaps of fun, and the February version always sells out really quickly so get your tickets now at www.artdeconapier.com or the Art Deco Trust.

Those rugby visitors that don't join in will be able to watch, and then understand just what it is that makes this city so different and take away a wonderful memory of their time here.

Once the Soup Kitchen meal has concluded we will see a remarkable performance by Les Kidams – a Contemporary Theatre company from New Caledonia which comes to us with the compliments of the French Embassy. This is a free event with the performance on the lawn in front of the Sound Shell stage that will last about 40 minutes.

It is entitled Eighth Day, a fable for all audiences that combines realism and fantasy, and provides fresh thinking for all on the relationship between man and his environment. This is a performance laced with energy, humour, imagination. Bring your beach chair – these are
